A wide range of organisations and individuals are running the events and the Festival is being co-ordinated by the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust (YDMT), a charity that works to support the environmental, social and economic well-being of this special area. Festival information

Below is information that will help you choose which events are for you and to help you get the most out of your visit. This programme includes details of any events and activities not included in the printed programme and also any details that have changed – new events and changes are listed below with full details **highlighted** on the relevant page. Please note that event details are believed to be correct at time of going to press but readers are strongly advised to contact the individual event provider to confirm the information given.

Booking and paying for an event

For some events you can simply turn up on the day but for most events you need to book places beforehand. Contact details to make bookings are given for each event. Many events are free but for those events where there is a charge, details of how to pay will be provided to you by the event organiser when you book. If an event has to be cancelled or altered for any reason, such as poor weather, the event organiser will try to let you know.

Children

Most of the events are suitable for children, usually accompanied by an adult, but please check with the event organiser.

Dogs

Please check in the event details or by contacting the event organiser whether dogs are allowed. If you can take your dog, please clean up after it and keep it on a short lead.

Guided walks

All of the walks have been graded so you can decide which routes you feel happy to tackle and to ensure you're properly prepared.

Easy - suitable for most people: short walks on well marked, even paths that may have stiles. Sturdy shoes with good grip necessary.

Moderate - longer walks with some hills, stiles and uneven paths. Boots advised.

Strenuous - long hill walks with steep climbs on uneven or boggy paths. Boots essential.

What should you bring?

The weather in the Dales, as any farmer will tell you, can be unpredictable. Even on sunny days, when you will need sun protection and a hat, it can quickly turn chilly on an exposed fellside so please be prepared. Depending on the event and its location you may need to bring a drink and snacks for short events and drinks and a packed lunch for longer events. The walk leader may not allow you on the walk if you are not properly prepared. If in doubt please ask the event organiser beforehand.

Flower identification guides

The National Park Centres and other outlets stock a wide range of excellent and affordable guides to the wildflowers and plants in the Dales, including a beautifully illustrated and water-proof leaflet showing the flowers and grasses of hay meadows, produced as part of the Hay Time project. These normally cost £1 (or £2 including p&p from YDMT) but please note that a free copy will be given to everyone who goes on a guided walk that includes a visit to a hay meadow (subject to availability).

Public transport

Many events are accessible by public transport so why not beat the traffic and be kinder to the environment by leaving the car at home and using other means to get to the Dales. Or you could leave your car on the edge of the Dales and use the bus or train to get to your destination. From Easter until the end of October extra summer bus services are run especially for visitors to the Dales. Please go to www.traveldales.org.uk for transport information. Event organisers may also be able to provide information.

What did you think?

It would be very helpful if you would let us know what you thought of the Festival, so at most events the event leader will hand out 'feedback forms'. These will be short and simple and can be completed after the event. The form will have a Freepost address so it won't cost you anything to post it back to YDMT. The Dales' landscape depends heavily on the local communities that live and work here. You can do your bit to help by staying locally and supporting local shops, restaurants, pubs and businesses as much as you can. You could also participate in the Donate to the Dales programme. This is our Visitor Payback Scheme, where you can pass on a donation to support the vital conservation work that ensures the Dales remain a special place for your next visit. If you want to help, look out for the Donate to the Dales collection boxes in National Park Centres and some businesses within the area. You could also pay for a tree to be planted in one of our native woodland restoration schemes - please contact YDMT to find out more.

Have a great time but...

Please don't pick any wildflowers - apart from spoiling it for other visitors, many wildflowers are sadly becoming rare and are legally protected, with heavy fines for those caught picking them. Also please walk in single file through hay meadows, as the crop is important as winter fodder for the farmer's livestock. Finally, please follow the Countryside Code: be safe, plan ahead and follow any signs; leave gates and property as you find them; protect plants and animals and take your litter home; keep dogs under close control; and consider other people.
